Objective: Students will learn how to read, write, speak and listen in English through a variety of different components as well as from the Every Day English program.

Classroom Environment: As learners, it is our responsibility to do our best to improve ourselves both academically and personally. In order to do this, a safe and productive classroom environment needs to be ensured for all students

Classroom Rules:

Be Safe

Always walk, keep your hands and feet to yourself at all times.

• Be Respectful / Honest

 Show respect toward students, teachers and school property. DO the right thing even when no one is watching.

• Be Responsible / Compassionate

 Turn in homework on time, be to class on time, wear your lanyard, do what is asked of you.

Do Your Best

 Use English to the best of your ability, as often as you can, ALWAYS try! If we practice what we learn we get better each day!

Any disruptive behavior will result in any or all of the following consequences:

- 1 Verbal Warning: You will be asked 1 time to change your behavior.
- Removal from desk/class, to work independently and silently away from other students, because it is not ok to interfere with others learning.
- Detention before or after School for 30 minutes depending on the number of infractions or the severity of the infraction.
- If the behavior continues a call home will be made and or a visit with administration.
- If you are late to class it will result in an automatic 30-minute detention after school that day.
- Any detention you get will need to be served within 4 days, failure to take care of it in 4 days your name goes to the office for ISS.

Grading Policy:

Throughout the semester, students will be given a variety of opportunities to earn points. Students need to be in class each day; they will complete quizzes, tests, projects and daily work/homework to earn points.

**Missing or unexcused late work will not be given full credit. Work not done will need to be done with-in 3 days of the due date, each day late is 10% off; this can be turned in before or after school unless other arrangements have been made. Unexcused missing work will NOT be accepted after 3 days for a grade and will receive a zero. Students will not be allowed to redo assignments if they have been handed in late.

**Students that have an excused absence from class will be given adequate time to complete their work. This will be decided on an individual basis depending on how many days/class periods the student has missed. It is your responsibility to talk with Mrs. Aguirre to make a plan to get the work you have missed. It is important that you are in class every day.

<u>Student Dismissal</u>: All students must be seated before the bell rings. No waiting by the door when you enter or before the bell to leave.

<u>iPad Use:</u> The iPad that you use in this class belongs to the school. Your iPad needs to be charged each day when you come to school and you need to have your charger with you every day. Please do not open your iPad lid unless you have been asked to. You must have your iPad in class each day and charged.
