<u>Warm-Up/Exit Tickets</u> will be completed daily, then posted in the grade book weekly. If a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to complete the missed warm-up/exit ticket(s).

<u>Homework Practice</u> may include but is not limited to: on-line practice from the lesson of the day or a review assignment.

Put it All Together Quizzes will be given as mid-module formative assessment checkpoints.

Module Tests will be given after each module.

<u>A Semester Test</u> will be given each semester. It will cover the content from only that semester. Semester tests cannot be made-up.

Absences: An absent student will have one day plus the number of days missed to turn in homework. A student who misses the day of a test will be required to make up the test the day he/she returns to class. If a student misses the day before the test and the test day, he/she will have the number of days missed to make up the test. Please communicate with me if other arrangements are necessary.

Academic Dishonesty: Academic dishonesty occurs when students obtain or assist others in obtaining credit for work which is not their own. All students involved will receive a zero for the assignment or assessment in question and a 30-minute detention.

Common examples of academic dishonesty include, but are not limited to the following:

- To use the work of another person as your own.
- To copy information from the Internet (work not cited), another student's work, theme, book report, test, etc.
- To prepare to cheat in advance (having a copy of the test in advance, use of notes during test, talking during the test).
