Course Description:

This course provides an introduction to the study of the world through the geographic perspective. The course will study the impacts and major themes of geography. The acquiring of map skills, understanding of the environmental, cultural, and economic differences of various regions around the world. The different government structures of major societies around the world and develop a further knowledge of the impact globalization has on our world today.
