Syllabus for Mrs. Aguirre

Objective: *Students will learn how to read, write, speak and listen in English through studying different topics in American History.*

Classroom Environment: As learners, it is our responsibility to do our best to improve ourselves both academically and personally. In order to do this, a safe and productive classroom environment needs to be ensured for all students.

Classroom Rules:

- **Be Safe**
 - Always walk, keep your hands and feet to yourself at all times.
- **Be Respectful / Honest**
 - Show respect towards students, teachers and school property. Do the right thing even when no one is watching.
- **Be Responsible / Compassionate**
 - Turn in homework on time, be to class on time, wear your lanyard, do what is asked of you.
- **Do Your Best**
 - Use English to the best of your ability, as often as you can, ALWAYS try! If we practice what we learn we get better each day!

Any disruptive behavior will result in any or all of the following consequences:

- 1 Verbal Warning: You will be asked 1 time to change your behavior
- Removal from desk, to work independently and silently away from other students
- Extra work/ work missed due to the disruption in the way of added reading, extra sentences, more problems etc.
- Detention before or after School for 30 minutes depending on the number of infractions or the severity of the infraction.
- If the behavior continues a call home will be made.
- If you are tardy it is an automatic 30-minute detention after school that day.
- Once you get a detention you have 4 days to take care of it before your name goes to the office.

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Grading Policy:

Throughout the semester, students will be given a variety of opportunities to earn points. Students need to be in class every day. Students will complete quizzes, tests, projects and daily work/Classwork to earn points.

Grades will be broken down:

Daily Engagement: 15%

Classwork / Homework: 30%

Tests: 40%

Projects: 15%

Semester Test Grade:

1st Semester - QT1- 45% / QT 2- 45% / 1st Semester Test = 10%

2nd Semester - QT 3 – 45%/QT 4- 45% / 2nd Semester Test =10%

**Students will have a daily engagement grade each week. It is so important for you to be here every day. If you are here, learning, and respectful you will keep all points.

**Missing or unexcused late work will not be given full credit. Work not done will need to be done within 3 days of the due date, each day late is 10% off; this can be turned in before or after school unless other arrangements have been made. Unexcused missing work will NOT be accepted after 3 days for a grade and will receive a zero. Students will not be allowed to redo assignments if they have been handed in late.

** Students that have an excused absence from class will be given adequate time to complete their work. This will be decided on an individual basis depending on how many days/ class periods the student has missed. It is your responsibility to talk with Mrs. Aguirre to get the work you have missed.

**Cheating will not be tolerated ~ Any cheating will result in a zero.

Materials Suggested: Pen or pencils, large notebook, Kleenex.

Student Dismissal: All students must be seated before the bell rings. No waiting by the door before class or at the end of class to leave.

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I-pad Use: The iPad that you use in this class belongs to the school. This means that it should only be used for educational purposes, any off task or inappropriate use of the iPad may result in loss of iPad privileges while in class. Your iPad needs to be charged each day when you come to school and you need to have your charger with you every day. Please do not open your iPad unless asked to.
